



Craft Kit 5: Tissue Paper Collage

Instructions:

- 1. Using your pencil, sketch your design on the cardstock.
- 2. Gradually apply a small amount glue to a portion of your paper.
- 3. Using your sketched design as a guide, apply the tissue paper to the cardstock with the glue.
- Experiment with the tissue paper to get different textures by twisting, rolling, flattening, bunching, or folding it. You can also cut or tear the tissue paper into different size pieces.
- 5. Repeat steps 2-4 until your cardstock is covered with tissue paper and your picture is complete.

Tissue Paper Collage: Materials



- Speckled cardstock
- Tissue paper in a variety of colors
- Glue
- Pencil and eraser

Step 1:

• Using your pencil, sketch out a possible design for how you want your final page to look on the cardstock.



Step 2:

• Gradually apply a small amount of glue to a portion of your paper.




Step 3:

Using your sketched design as a guide, apply the tissue paper to the cardstock.



Step 4:

 Experiment with the tissue paper to get different textures by twisting, rolling, flattening, bunching, or folding it. You can also cut or rip your tissue paper into different size pieces.



Step 5:

• Repeat steps 2-4 until your cardstock is covered with tissue paper and your picture is complete!
