



Craft Kit 3: Skull Mandala CAUTION: kit contains Borax

Instructions:

- With the help of an adult, mix 3 tablespoons of Borax in a bowl of <u>boiling</u> water until it <u>dissolves completely</u>. Place skull in the bowl and let sit over night.
- 2. Fold the pieces of paper in half and arrange in a overlapping circular pattern.
- 3. Starting from the outside, use craft glue to attach the pieces to the wood block forming a circle. Move inward and glue down the next circle of paper overlapping the previous circle. Continue for 4 layers.
- 4. With the help of an adult, use a hot glue gun to attach your crystalized skull to the center.



Rites of Passage

How to Make Your Own Skull Mandala





Materials

- 4"x4" piece of wood (you can use cardstock instead)
- Rubber skull (found at craft stores or online)
- Punched or hand cut pieces of paper
- Craft glue
- Hot glue gun
- 3 table spoons Borax
- 1 cup boiling water
- Small bowl

Step 1:

 Add 1 cup of boiling water to a small bowl. Stir in 3 tablespoons of Borax until it dissolves.



^{*}When using Borax, be careful to not inhale, ingest, or get into your eyes.

Step 2:

 Place your skull into the mixture and let it sit for 8 hours, or until it crystalizes.



Step 3:

 Fold all of the paper pieces in half and unfold so they have a crease down the center.



Step 4:

 Arrange your paper pieces to create a pattern you like and then glue them down using craft glue.



Step 5:

 Using a hot glue gun, attach your skull to the center of the wooden square.
