Tulsa, OK- 108|Contemporary is excited to present *My Soul Looks Back and Wonder How I Got Over*, featuring the artists Skip Hill and Letitia Huckaby.

My Soul Looks Back and Wonder How I Got Over is a thoughtful visual dialogue commemorating the 1921 Tulsa Race Massacre. Similar to the gospel song it is named after, the exhibition emphasizes the themes of personal survival and spiritual transcendence. Hill and Huckaby examine how the past informs our present, and how the persistence of hope redeems us to our present, and our future.

Tulsa-based artist Skip Hill's contributions to this exhibition feature mixed-media paintings that pay homage to the residents of historic Greenwood and original collages he created as illustrations for *Opal's Greenwood Oasis*, a new children's book from authors Najah-Amatullah Hylton and Qurayash Ali Lansana.

Letitia Huckaby will be featuring work from her series *Beautiful Blackness* which explores the tradition of visual storytelling. Huckaby creates unique works by printing photography onto vintage fabrics, including flour and sugar sacks, carrying a story and connecting the past to the present.

This exhibition is made possible by Robin Ballenger and VISION Tulsa, a grant program supported by the City of Tulsa and the Tulsa Arts Commission.
